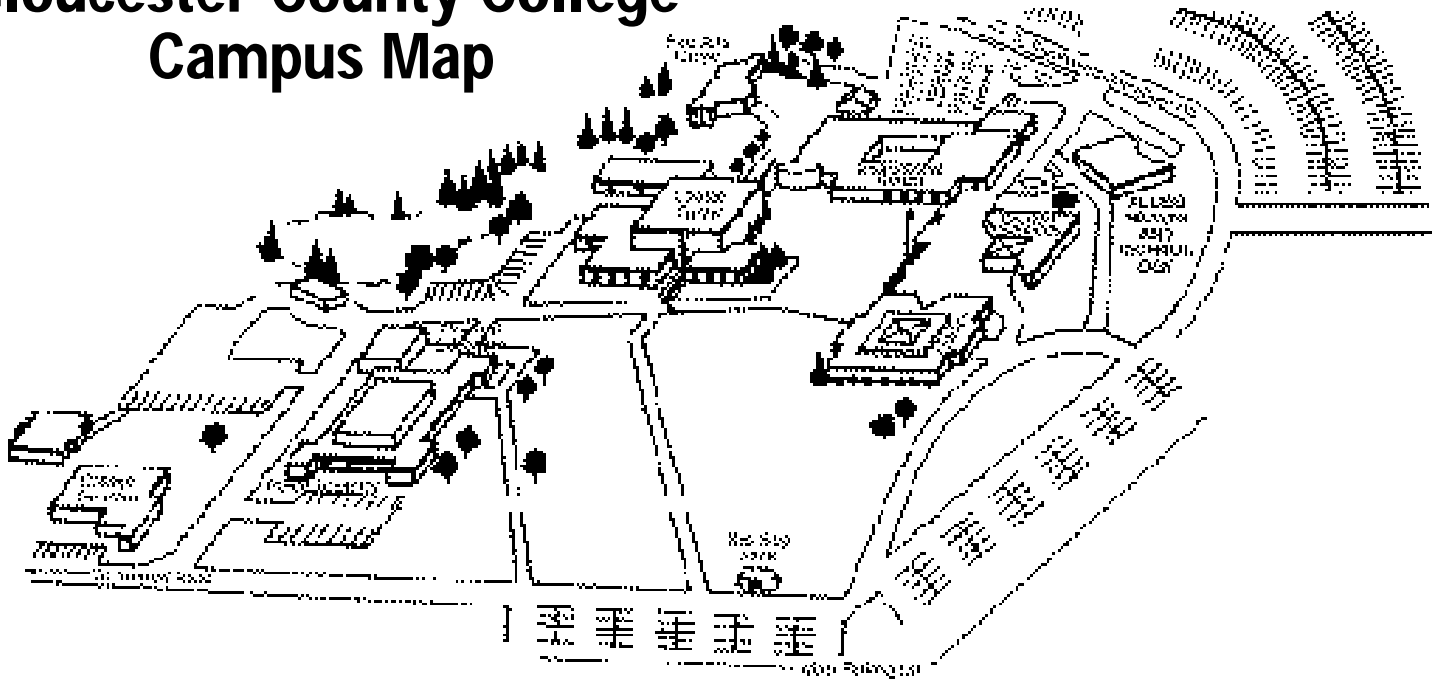


Gloucester County College Campus Map

Corel Offers Free Download of WordPerfect 3.5 for Macintosh

COREL CORPORATION announces that the free download for Corel WordPerfect 3.5 Enhancement Pack for Macintosh is now available from its Web site at www.corel.com/products/macintosh/wpmac35/newdownload. Corel announced in July that it would make Corel WordPerfect 3.5 Enhancement Pack for Macintosh available as a free* download. Despite some minor incompatibilities with the latest release of the Mac OS, Corel believes that WordPerfect 3.5 for Macintosh continues to provide great value to the Macintosh community.

Corel WordPerfect 3.5 Enhancement Pack for Macintosh, released in August, 1997, is the latest version of this product by Corel. The version that is available for download is a complete product and not just a patch, update or add-on pack to a previous version. This download offers new and existing customers a complete word-processing solution and incorporates all updates and patches issued by Corel subsequent to the original product release. The free* download consists of the WordPerfect application and utilities only. Clipart, web art, sounds, templates and some fonts that are included with the full product will not be included in the downloadable package. Customers who wish to purchase the full product may still do so through Corel Customer Service (1-800-77-COREL) or through Corel eStore, while quantities last.

"WordPerfect 3.5 Enhancement Pack for Macintosh offers incredible value with its compatibility with older, non-power PC-based Macintoshes, speed, customizability and rich functionality," said John Geleynse, Macintosh brand manager at Corel Corporation. No Further Versions to Be Released

Aging source code and increasing differences in functionality between the Macintosh and Windows versions of WordPerfect have made it no longer feasible for Corel to enhance or build on the WordPerfect 3.5 Macintosh code base. Therefore, no further versions of WordPerfect for Macintosh will be released based on the 3.5 code base.

Apple Sues eMachines Inc. for Illegal Copying of iMac Design

Apple filed a complaint against eMachines, Inc. for illegally copying the industrial design of Apple's award-winning iMac™ computer.

The complaint, filed in U.S. Federal Court in San Jose, California, seeks to enjoin eMachines from distributing computers that illegally copy Apple's designs, and asks for actual and punitive damages resulting from such illegal conduct.

"There is an unlimited number of original designs that eMachines could have created for their computers, but instead they chose to copy Apple's designs," said Steve Jobs, Apple's interim CEO. "We've invested a lot of money and effort to create and market our award-winning computer designs, and we intend to protect them under the law."

Apple filed a similar lawsuit against Future Power and Daewoo on July 1, 1999.

MacWorld Tip

End of an Era Intermediate

Apple ended the extended warranty program on its notoriously funky AppleVision 1710 and 1710AV monitors at the end of 1998 so if you own one of these displays and it goes south, you're on your own. Because you are on your own this tip may help: Should you wake one day to find that your monitor's green LED lights up but the screen remains black, you may be able to fix the problem by resetting the monitor.

Here's how:

With the power off, jack the display into a Power Mac running AppleVision software version 1.5.5 or later. Make the proper connections (power, video, and ADB) and fire up the Mac while holding down the Command-Option-A-V keys until you hear the system beep sound. This beep means that the monitor has been reset. With any luck, this reset procedure will cure your monitor's ills.

iBook Possibilities Fire the Imagination

WELL, EVERYONE, this is my first article for MugShots. I'll do my best.

I work at the University of Pennsylvania in Mac IT Support, and we sometimes get to view important Macintosh events via a satellite down-link. I was very excited to see the keynote address of the MacWorld Expo, and look forward to getting Halo . . . I mean, an iBook (Bungie is great!).

All afternoon on July 21st the Apple Store for Education was down, but I did manage to get through just before midnight and place an order for a blueberry iBook. Hopefully this means I'll get one in an early shipment, but we'll see.

The next great thing was that last week, August 12, Penn's Apple rep was here at our Mac-Net meeting to show us one of the prototype iBooks. He also explained more details about the iBook and the AirPort technology. For those who missed this, AirPort is Apple's and Lucent's implementation of the IEEE 802.11 wireless networking standard (see MugShots June/July issue). Apple's AirPort hub will allow up to 10 client computers to communicate at 11 megabit/sec. It also includes an onboard Ethernet port and 56.6k modem, and can share that connection with any AirPort-enabled computers in a 150-foot range.

The hub costs about \$300, and an AirPort card for the iBook costs about \$100. This is in contrast to \$300 cards for most other laptops, at speeds only reaching 2 megabit/sec.

Two AirPort-enabled computers can communicate directly without requiring a hub, and one AirPort-enabled computer can use a software version of the hub to share its network or Internet connection with an iBook.

Unfortunately, Apple's hubs do not allow hands-off roaming. To move your iBook to another area you are required to either tell it what hub you are near, or pick from a list of available hubs. The hubs can require pass logins to allow connectivity. The Apple rep said that Lucent will be working on a roaming-enabled AirPort solution.

Takeoff Possibilities Using AirPort

1. Share a single cable-modem connection with every computer in your house. PCI-card versions of AirPort are expected soon. Once they are available, you could plug an AirPort hub into the cable-modem and all computers in the house could share it simultaneously with one IP address. If you only have one desktop computer and one iBook, you could use the software version of the hub to share the desktop's internet connection with your iBook.
2. Have a hub (or several) in every classroom and students can all share that connection.
3. Walk up to a friend with an iBook and share files, play games, etc. with no cables required.

Other Observations

1. The handle has a reinforcing steel rod all through it, providing a firm, rugged grip that won't flex or break off.
2. It's possible to view the iBook's very sharp TFT screen from a fairly steep angle, allowing others to see what you're trying to show them without crowding directly behind you.
3. The iBook's latchless opening mechanism is very smooth and natural. It stays shut even when shaken, and will hold steadily at many different angles when open.
4. The case material is rugged and comfortable to hold.
5. The trackpad edges are smoothly matched to the surface around them, reducing potential dust and grime buildup.

I'm looking forward to receiving my iBook, and hope that AirPort technology quickly becomes available to desktops via PCI.

Apple and Akamai Reveal Apple Investment to Cement Strategic Agreement

Apple and Akamai (pronounced AH kuh my) Technologies announced further details of their strategic agreement regarding streaming media, as well as revealed an investment by Apple in Akamai.

Announced in late July at Macworld Expo in New York City, the strategic agreement centers on the integration of Apple's QuickTime player and streaming server technology with Akamai's global Internet content delivery service to provide Macintosh and Windows users worldwide with one-click access to high-quality streaming video content. In addition to Akamai's integration of QuickTime servers into its network, Apple has selected Akamai as its exclusive network provider for QuickTime TV (QTV).

To cement the partnership, Apple invested \$12.5 million in June in Akamai, for approximately five percent of the shares of the company at the time the investment was made.

"We chose Akamai as the exclusive delivery service for our QuickTime TV network because they have the best, most scalable architecture and proven reliability," said Steve Jobs, Apple's interim CEO. "Together, Apple and Akamai will deliver the highest quality and easiest to use Internet streaming video content available."

"Our relationship with Apple is a major step in delivering high-quality streaming," said George Conrades, Akamai chairman and CEO. "QuickTime TV offers Internet users a whole new viewing experience and empowers web sites to create more engaging content."

Apple has used Akamai's global network to deliver copies of QuickTime and Mac® OS 8.6 software upgrades as well as the Star Wars: Episode I The Phantom Menace movie trailer to Apple customers around the world. Apple and Akamai have also broadcast two live events: Steve Jobs' recent Macworld Expo keynote and an Apple-sponsored Eurythmics concert.

In an unrelated press release today, Akamai also announced that Cisco Systems has made an investment in the company.

QuickTime 4 has been downloaded by over 10 million users since it was introduced on April 19, and is the first Internet streaming solution to use non-proprietary industry-standard protocols Real Time Protocol (RTP) and Real Time Streaming Protocol (RTSP). Additionally, as part of Apple's Darwin Open Source initiative, the QuickTime streaming server source code is available to developers at www.apple.com/developer.

After an installation, simply run Installer Observer again and click the Load and Examine Changes Made button. Installer Observer will then detail the changes made to your Mac's software.
